The Early Years sector refers to the learning and care a child receives up to age five. Early years education settings include nurseries, preschools, childminders and school reception classes. What do I need to start my career?

You don't always need a qualification to start your career in early years and childcare but a L3 qualification is something that nurseries and pre-schools often look for, and will help you progress.

The right soft skills are important, including an interest in early child development.

You will need a DBS check, and will undertake regular safeguarding training.

To work as a childminder you will need first aid and childcare training.

Many childcare and teaching assistant roles have apprenticeship opportunities.
